50th Anniversary Airport Day & Plane Pull®

Over 250,000 pounds of a FedEx A310, more than 1,200 people and countless smiles and laughs were all part of the Gerald R. Ford International Airport's 50th Anniversary Airport Day & Plane Pull® on Saturday, July 19.



The celebration, held to commemorate fifty years of aviation at our current location, was open to the public and featured numerous activities, aircraft displays, 50-cent food, a skydiving exhibition, and a Law Enforcement Torch Run Plane Pull Challenge® to benefit Special Olympics Michigan.

The day started with last season's American Idol Top 10 Finalist Maurice Townsend singing "God Bless America" as a team of skydivers from Central Michigan Skydivers descended onto airport grounds with the American flag. NHL veteran and East Kentwood native Mike Knuble also spoke to the athletes, giving them words of advice for the Plane Pull, and telling emcee Tim Doty from FOX 17 about his experiences flying in and out of GRR over the last 17 years as a professional hockey player. Then, Plane Pull participants began their quest to tackle pulling the FedEx A310 twelve feet in the fastest time. Twenty-five person teams raised over \$8,000 for Special Olympics at the event!



In addition to the Plane Pull, face painting, balloon animals and an inflatable obstacle course were available to entertain the kids. For the adults, there was a prize drawing for which the Grand Prize was a \$200 Southwest Airlines gift card. All ages were eligible to spin a prize wheel to win one of a variety of giveaway items. 50-cent food including hot dogs, ice cream, chips and fruit were a hit as many families ate for under five dollars! Grand Rapids Griffins' mascot, Griff, even stopped by to shake hands and greet our guests.

"We have been celebrating our 50th Anniversary throughout the year, but this celebration was a way to thank the West Michigan community for supporting our local airport and local jobs," said GFIA Executive

Director Brian Ryks. "Not only were we thrilled to celebrate our anniversary, but we are proud to support Special Olympics and its efforts across Michigan."

Static aircraft displays were also a huge hit for kids and adults alike as many got to see inside planes, snow removal equipment and airport fire trucks for the first time. A special thank you goes out to all of the tenants and those who participated in the event! We appreciate you taking time to speak with the public and show off your aircraft and equipment.

Safety Is A Top Priority At GFIA

When travelers arrive at an airport, airfield safety isn't likely one of their top concerns. On the contrary, it's more of an unconscious expectation. At GFIA, we like to keep it that way. We work hard to maintain the infrastructure at or above standards every day. While the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) performs an inspection once each year, GFIA staff performs frequent internal inspections and takes immediate action to ensure safe operations on our airfield.



The FAA inspection goes beyond just looking at airfield conditions. They review our records to ensure that appropriate training occurs, internal inspections are being done, and that best practice standards are being used. Although each annual inspection lasts just two to three days, the process of ensuring a safe airfield is a 365-day per year job.

The divisions most impacted by and responsible for airfield safety include Field Maintenance, Building Maintenance, Operations, and Aircraft Rescue Fire Fighting. For the men and women in these departments it's not just about what they do, but about how they do it. They work together as a team to inspect, repair (if needed) and maintain the runways, taxiways, aircraft ramps, lighting, perimeter fences, and fields. They keep detailed records on the work they do, their daily findings, training and more.

Our 2014 inspection was completed in July with excellent results. So, next time you fly through GFIA just remember, we've done all we can and more to make your trip as safe as possible.

Expanding Our Horizons

Beginning Wednesday, September 3, 2014 West Michigan travelers will have even more choices for air travel as two new nonstop destinations are added. As a result of the merger between American Airlines and US Airways, GFIA partons will soon be able to fly to - or connect through - the Philadelphia International Airport (PHL) and the Charlotte Douglas International Airport (CLT). Each new route will begin with twice daily service.

Via Charlotte Douglas International, travelers can connect to nearly 100 domestic and more than 30 international destinations around the globe. Or, you may want to make North Carolina your final destination. With professional basketball, hockey, and football teams, plus the NASCAR Hall of Fame, sports fans can find plenty to do right in the state!

Via Philadelphia International, more than 125 nonstop domestic and international destinations are available. History buffs may prefer to stay in Philadelphia and explore the architecture, museums and more. (And who doesn't crave an authentic Philly Cheesesteak?)

The addition of these two new cities means that West Michigan travelers can choose from a total of 24 nonstop routes to and from GFIA.
