

New Sunny Destinations, Just In Time For The Holidays

Just in time for holiday travel...nonstop service from the Gerald R. Ford International Airport (GRR) to Miami International Airport (MIA) will begin in Grand Rapids this winter. American Airlines has announced that, beginning December 19, 2018, it will feature a once daily trip in and out of Miami International Airport. The flight will be operated by American Eagle and tickets are on sale now.

“This new service to Miami gives our customers in western Michigan unprecedented access to our gateway to Latin American and the Caribbean,” said Billy Glunz, American’s director – State and Local Government Affairs. “From Miami, American offers nearly 350 daily flights to 43 countries and territories, now just a stop away from Grand Rapids.”



The flight schedule for the new service includes a departure time from Grand Rapids daily at 6:05 am, and a daily return flight from MIA to GRR arriving at 12:48 am.

From mid-November through April, Frontier announced it will be offering non-stop flights three times weekly to Tampa International Airport, a particularly welcome addition for those wanting to escape the traditional cold and snowy Michigan winters.

Do you prefer a drier heat and the vast desert expanse over an ocean view? Frontier Airlines has got you covered with its new nonstop service to Phoenix-Sky Harbor International Airport (PHX) beginning on

Passenger Numbers Are Soaring!

Five consecutive years of record-breaking growth is certainly not what most airports have experienced in recent years. At GFIA, we have seen annual growth rates from 4.06% to 9.21% and our 2018 year-to-date increase over 2017 is 14.98% as we grow toward a possible sixth consecutive year. We are currently on target to surpass the three million passenger mark this year!

“We are happy to see the record-breaking passenger counts continuing into the summer months,” said Gerald R. Ford International Airport President & CEO Jim Gill. “We are seeing increases on the schedule with American adding mainline service to Dallas, Delta adding more frequency to New York-LaGuardia, and United’s capacity to Chicago and Denver increasing.”

Each month of 2018 has resulted in record-breaking passenger numbers, and the Ford Airport is coming off a 2017 that saw over

Airport Project Wins Prestigious Award



On July 28, the Great Lakes Chapter American Association of Airport Executives announced that the Gerald R. Ford International Airport's Gateway Transformation, Phase One project was selected as its Commercial Airport Architectural Project of the Year! This prestigious award is based on many criteria including showing a

unique solution to a common problem, demonstrating resourcefulness, cost-effectiveness, and being environmentally sound.

Some of the features of the Gateway Transformation Project that stood out to the judges were the vegetated "green" roof that was installed over portions of the project with supply of the system and plants from a local Michigan-based company. Portions of the "green" roof can be viewed from the observation area overlook. The displacement air ventilation system used in the marketplace distributes conditioned air throughout only the lower level of occupied spaces to save energy. A 15-foot roof overhang with solar grating and Solara glass (high insulating translucent glazing) was used in help control solar gain and glare along the southeast facing facade of the checkpoint and marketplace.

A variety of amenities such as work hubs, four new business centers/lounges, a Military Welcome Center, Nursing Rooms, and Children's Play Areas support the diverse needs of passengers. All furniture was sourced from local manufacturers, minimizing shipping costs and energy consumption while boosting the local economy.

A unique aspect of this project was the airport's outreach to key community businesses and leaders for guidance in determining goals for the project as well as creating sponsorship opportunities within the terminal. Private donations contributed over \$17 million towards the cost of the project.

Special Olympians Head Out West



On June 30, more than 40 Special Olympics athletes left GRR en route to Seattle for the USA Games. The send-off and celebration helped mark Special Olympics' 50th Anniversary, and the USA games and many local athletes were featured on ESPN's coverage of the event. November 15, 2018. With twice-weekly departures on Mondays and Fridays, you could plan a week long vacation or a great weekend getaway.

The addition of nonstop service to Miami marks the 25th nonstop destination served out of Grand Rapids, and the eighth city in Florida. American Airlines has served Gerald R. Ford International Airport passengers for over 25 years, and also has nonstop service to Chicago-O'Hare, Dallas/ Fort Worth, Washington, D.C., Charlotte, and Philadelphia.

Phoenix becomes the 26th nonstop destination for West Michigan travelers. Frontier re-entered the Grand Rapids market in 2017 with nonstop flights to Denver, Orlando, and seasonal service to Fort Myers, and Philadelphia. Phoenix and Tampa mark the fifth and sixth cities the airline serves from GRR, respectively.

In addition to the service provide by American and Frontier Airlines, our other carriers - Delta, Southwest, United, and Allegiant - offer flights to Atlanta, Baltimore, Chicago-Midway, Denver, Detroit, Fort Lauderdale, Fort Myers, Houston, Las Vegas, Minneapolis, New York-LaGuardia, New York-Newark, Orlando International, Orlando-Sanford, Phoenix-Mesa, Punta Gorda, St. Petersburg-Clearwater International, Tampa International, Washington-Reagan National, and Washington-Dulles.

With 120 daily flights to all these destinations, it's no wonder that *Getting There Is Better Here.*

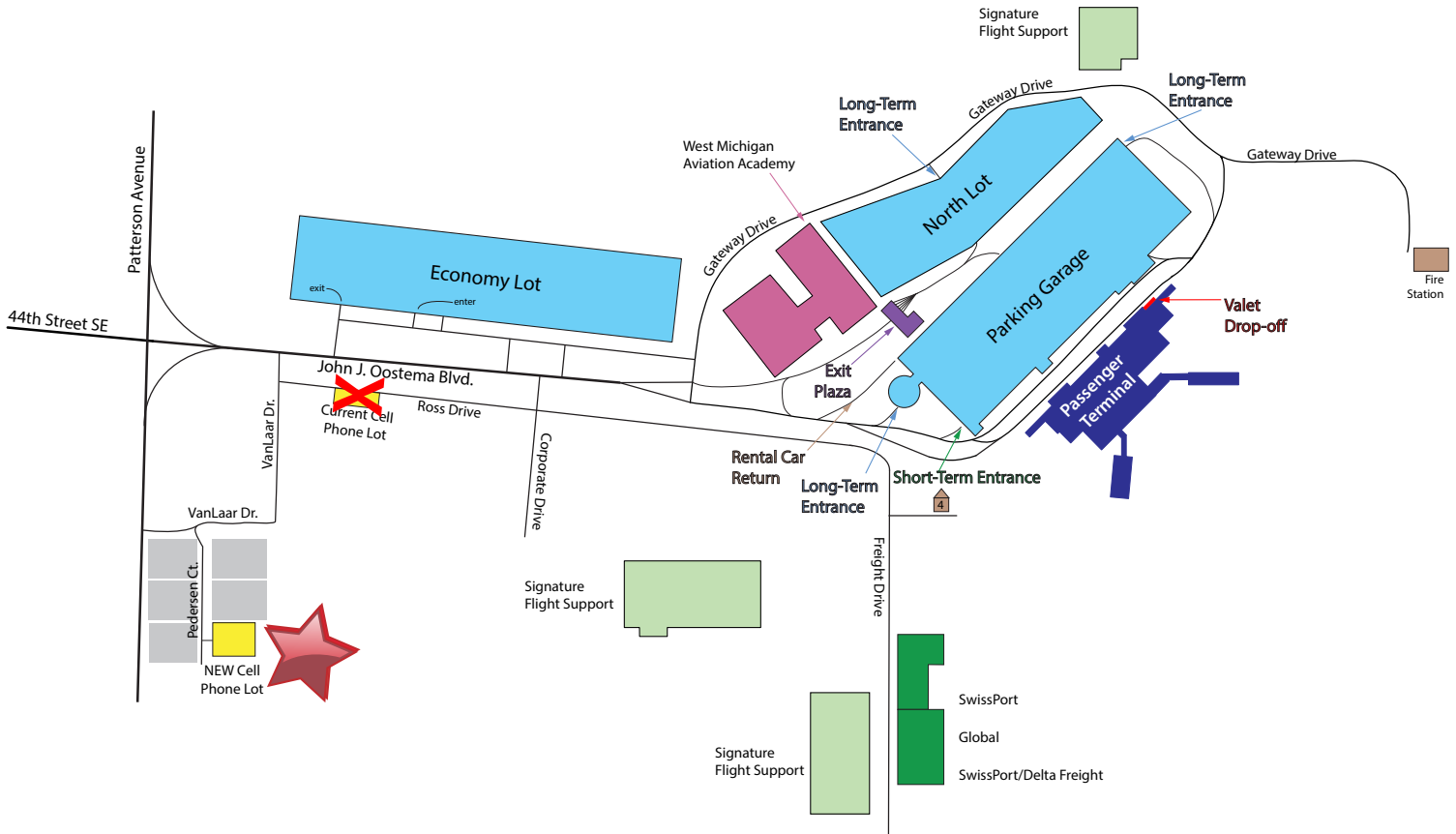

2.8 million passengers. GRIA has seen growth in 59 of the past 66 months.

The upcoming summer is expected to be the busiest summer in the history of U.S. air travel, according to trade group Airlines for America. The group estimates that over 246 million passengers will fly in the U.S. between June 1 and August 31, 2018. Historically low fares and a strong economy are noted for aiding in that forecasted record-breaking summer travel period.

Cell Phone Lot Relocating

The Cell Phone Lot, one of our most popular amenities, currently located on Ross Drive, is being relocated to improve safety and accessibility. An added benefit is that this move will also decrease the roadway congestion along Ross Dr., which is a main route for construction traffic hauling equipment and material for our aircraft apron reconstruction project (see below) as well as a new private hangar that is being constructed just west of Corporate Drive. The new cell phone lot is expected to open around Labor Day. Keep watch for new signs!



Fire Fighters Become Masters of Their Craft

Firefighters Nate German and Dan Kipen have earned the Airport Master Firefighter (A.M.F.) designation. This prestigious title is the first level of the Aircraft Rescue Fire Fighting (ARFF) Professional Designation Program. This program is sponsored by the American Association of Aviation Executives (AAAE) and the Aircraft Rescue Fire Fighting Working Group (ARFFWG), collectively known as the ARFF Training Alliance. The A.M.F. program confirms that associates understand, to an acceptable degree, the ARFF Body of Knowledge essential to carry out the responsibilities to manage an airport fire department and have a basic understanding of airport administration and management.

Nate and Dan successfully completed the prerequisite set of requirements, which included employment of at least three years as an airport firefighter as well as completion of both the National Incident Management System (NIMS) 100/200/700 courses and an ARFF training program. They earned their official A.M.F. designation by successfully passing the requisite A.M.F. exam. These two fire fighters join nine others on our team to earn this designation.
